The Gospel, Sickness and Healing James 5:13-18

Read James 5:13-18 and pray that God would give you spiritual insight.

- 1. What is the first thing that you do when you become ill?
- 2. Can we expect that our prayer (or the prayers of the elders for us) will make us well? Take a look at V. 15
- 3. Are there occasions in the new Testament where prayers for the sick do not lead to their healing? (1 Tim. 5:3; 2 Corinthians 12:8)
- 4. What was the purpose of healing miracles in the ministry of Jesus (Luke 4:18, 7:18-23)? What was its purpose in the ministry of the apostles (Luke 9:2; 10:9)?
- 5. Should we expect the same kinds of healing ministries we find in the New Testament? Why or why not? Here is a quote to ponder from the Westminster Confession of Faith (5.3) on God's miraculous workings: "God, in His ordinary providence, makes use of means, yet is free to work without, above, and against them, at His pleasure."
- 6. What should we do when God does not heal our sickness (5:7-8)? Is there a beginning and end to sickness according to these verses? When does all sickness end?
- 7. V. 14 James mentions "oil" should be used by the elders on the sick person. Some people believe oil was used medicinally as in the ancient writings Philo (B.C. 20 - 50 A.D.), Pliny (24-79 A.D.) and Galen (129-210 A.D.) and Luke 10:34 (remember, Luke was a doctor). Others believe that the anointing with oil was a sign of God's presence and the work of God's Spirit (Leviticus 14:1-18). What do you think?
- 8. What is the relationship between taking medicine and praying for healing?
- 9. Why does James draw such a close connection between sickness, sin and the confession of sin (v. 15-16)? Can sin lead to physical sickness (1 Cor. 11:27-30; Acts 12:23)?
- 10. Are there occasions when sickness is not caused by our sin (John 9:1-3)?
- 11.What is God's purpose for us in sickness or in health according to Romans 8:28-29? What should our deliberate aim be in either (1 Corinthians 10:31)?
- 12.What is James' point by drawing our attention to Elijah how are we similar and how are we different to him (v. 17-18)?
